**Smoking**  
Smoking is considered a violation of the Institute premises or at any time students involved in any function associated with the Institute. Students are not to have cigarettes, matches or lighters in their possession at the Institute. Students who contravene this policy will be given a suitable punishment.

**Mobile Phones**  
TIEL students are encouraged not to bring mobile phones to the Institute. If they do bring them, they should be handed into the Administration and staff offices. Students are seen with a mobile phone at any stage it will be confiscated to the end of the year.

**Use of TIEL Property**  
It is strictly the task of all students to keep clean and tidy wherever they occupy. All Institute equipment should be used with respect and care.

**Other**  
Students are forbidden on TIEL grounds to use alcohol, drugs, and other items which will be detrimental to the health of the students.

**Spending**  
Students are encouraged to spend their money on books, stationery, and other educational materials. They should not spend money on entertainment, luxury items, or anything that is considered wasteful.

**Attendance**  
Students are expected to attend all classes and activities. Absence without a valid reason will be recorded and may result in disciplinary action.

**Books and Material**  
Books and materials should be properly looked after. Parents are reminded that students who are required to wear helmets.

**Leaving TIEL Grounds**  
Students wishing to leave TIEL before end of their tutorial sessions must bring written permission from a parent/guardian which is to be handed to the Institute Office before start of classes. Before leaving, they must have their Institute ID card and a request for permission will only be granted for legitimate reasons for e.g. medical appointments.

85% to 97% marks in monthly tests:	Rs. 2000 in cash
75% to 85% marks in monthly tests:	Rs. 1000 in cash

Those students who secure 97% marks in their Board Exams will be supported for their College Fee.

I wish best of luck to the students for their upcoming examinations and hope that they will make us proud by acquiring good grades.

## Documentary of The Institute of Emerging Leaders


“The Crew” a team of two students, Muhammad Shahrukh and Daneyal Aamer kindly consented to make the TiEL Documentary. For the purpose interviews were held and shoots were carried out in Lahore and Islamabad. The TiEL Documentary is a promotional video and describes what services are being offered to the Christian students at TiEL. It explains the present day despondency of the Christian community in Pakistan by drawing the viewers’ attention to the policies of the past governments that have been the major cause of illiteracy and joblessness among the Christian Community today. It explains how good quality education was made inaccessible to the Christian community because of which they were pushed away from the mainstream high ranking jobs in the Public and Private sectors and have been subjected to earn their livelihood through menial and low paid jobs. It also throws light on the miseries of the Christian students who want to get education but are being denied admissions in Missionary, Government and Elite Private Schools due to the weak economical conditions of their families.



Renowned personalities from the Christian community in Lahore and Islamabad were interviewed for the purpose which included Mr. Anthony A. Lamuel, General Secretary Pakistan Bible Society; Mr. Shahid Ambrose Moghul, Principal St. Anthony’s High School and College; Dr. Christy Munir, Principal Foreman Christian College, A Chartered University, Mr. Maxwell Shanti, Principal St. Anthony’s High School; Ms. Jennifer Jivan, Acting Head of Christian Study Centre; Mr. Asher John, Chief News Editor Pakistan Today Ms. Twinkle Sohail Khokhar, Asian Women Power Lifting Champion; Chairman I-LAP Sajid Ishaq and Executive Director I-LAP Nazia Ansari. ## Parent Teacher Meeting, Saturday January 23, 2016

The second Parent Teacher Meeting was held with a good participation of parents. Subject Teachers were allocated a separate table each so that they could freely discuss the progress of the students in each subject, giving private and personal time to each parent. It was good to observe the attitude change and seriousness the parents displayed on viewing the Monthly Test results of their children. Mothers and fathers appeared truly concerned regarding the studies of their children and were eager to cooperate with the teachers and the Administration for assisting their children in obtaining good grades in future.



Executive Director Nazia Ansari stressed upon the parents to curb absenteeism in their children as they were already weak in studies and being absent frequently disturbed their studies and consequently their monthly grades. She also reminded the parents to inform the Administration through a telephone call or a written application incase their child would be absent so that absenteeism, especially of boys, would remain in check. She told the parents that it had come to the notice of the Administration that there had been a few instances where the parents were not aware that their son had not attended the Institute.

Chairman I-LAP also addressed the parents and the students and announced that the following incentives will be given to the parents on full attendance of their children and to the students for obtaining good grades from the month of February:

## Training on Food and Nutrition, Monday January 25, 2016

Training on Food and Nutrition was carried out to introduce the students to a daily balanced and healthy diet. The students were explained why it is important to keep the bodies healthy and how various food groups play their required share in providing nourishment to different parts of their bodies. Through a Power point Presentation they were showed the nutrition value and calories of the popular foods they prefer to eat and how they only add up in their bodies without giving them any energy boost. The students took keen interest in the training and were enthusiastic in taking down notes of the facts that interested them.

After the food pyramid was discussed in detail, they were divided into four groups. Each group was asked to prepare a daily diet chart so that food from each food group was included in a balanced manner. The students enjoyed the activity and came out with inspiring daily diet charts.

After the training all students appeared highly motivated to eat their greens on daily basis and include dairy items and assorted nuts in their daily diet.

#### RULES
