**Smoking**  
Smoking is forbidden at the Institute premises or at any time students attend any function associated with the Institute. Students are not allowed to carry, use, or possess any smoking materials in the Institute. Students who contravene this policy will be given a suitable consequence.

**Mobile Phones**  
TiEL students are encouraged not to bring mobile phones to the Institute. However, if preferred by parents, they should be handed into the Administration and collected after the classes. If students are seen with mobile phones, at any stage it will be confiscated for collection at the end of the class.

**Care of TiEL**  
Students to keep clean and tidy the place they occupy. Institute equipment should be treated with respect.

**Drugs and Alcohol**  
Infringement of this policy will be severely dealt with. No student will be permitted to bring any drugs or alcohol to the Institute premises.

**Excursions**  
Parents must give their written permission for all excursions. Students must adhere to the TiEL requirements concerning a minimum standard of conduct.

**Bicycles and Motor Bikes**  
Bicycles and motorbikes should be properly locked. Parents are reminded that students who ride bikes are required to wear helmets.

**Leaving TiEL Grounds**  
Students wishing to leave TiEL before end of their tutorial sessions must bring written permission from a parent/guardian which is to be handed in to the Admin Office before start of classes. Before leaving, they must have their names entered into a register. Permission will only be granted for legitimate reasons (for e.g. medical appointments).

### CODE FOR STUDENTS

**General**  
Students are to be regularly present in class. They should bring their own stationery, proper dress code, and appropriate shoes. They should also bring their own water bottles or thermos.

**Dress Code**  
Students should adhere to the dress code of the Institute.
